In addition, while there are many people who speak another language and have no difficulty with English, there are still individuals who speak English "less then very well." The Census Bureau measures English proficiency for individuals who are ages 5 and over. Additional information on Limited English Proficiency is available at https://www.lep.gov/

For counties with small populations and small population groups within larger counties, the margins of error can be quite large.

The margin of error tells us how precise the estimate is by indicating the <u>range within which the estimate most likely falls</u>.


